30 JANUARY 2022

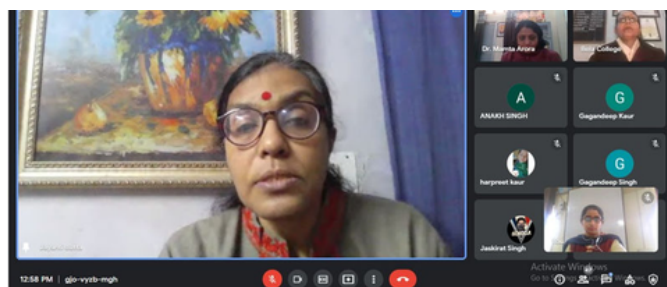

About 84 participants participated in this webinar and enhanced their knowledge.

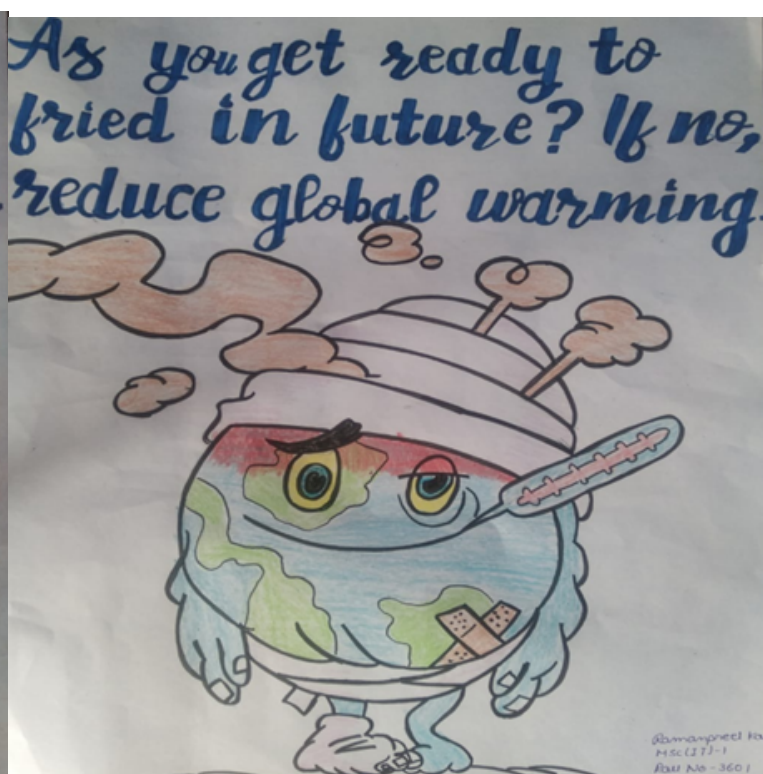
One-day webinar was organized by the Department of English on the topic “Making Students Fiction: Teaching Critical Thinking”.

SAHIBZADA AJIT SINGH'S BIRTHDAY 11 FEBRUARY

On 11th February, 2022, the birthday of Baba Ajit Singh, the eldest son of Guru Gobind Singh, was celebrated with great pomp and ceremony.

Sahibzada Ajit Singh (11 February 1687 - 7 December 1705), the eldest of four sons of Guru Gobind Singh, was born to Mata Jito ji (also known as Mata Sundari ji) at Paonta sahib on 11 February 1687.

When he was still in his teens, Sahibzada Ajit Singh led the army of the Guru in the struggle against the Mughals' tyranny (the Rulers at that time). He had been so enlightened even at a very young age to comprehend the spiritual teachings of his Great Father, who founded "Khalsa" on April 13, 1699. (A pious way of life by which one realizes how to comply over this materialistic world). In 1704, while battling the Mughals in the Punjabi district of Rupnagar, he was martyred along with his brother Jujhar Singh. Their sacrifice for others and self-respect is never forgotten and is remembered in hearts of generations to come. We bow our heads to remember the sacred soul.

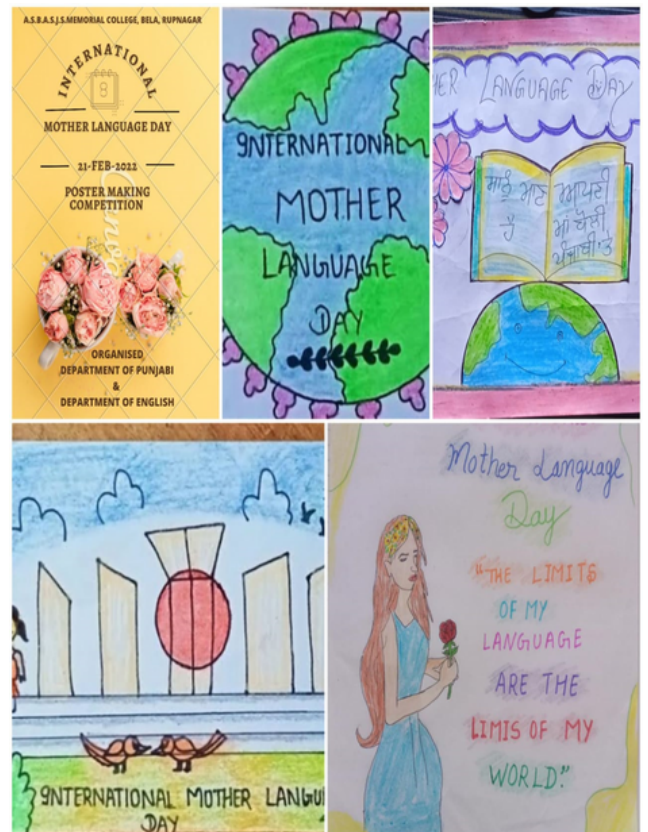

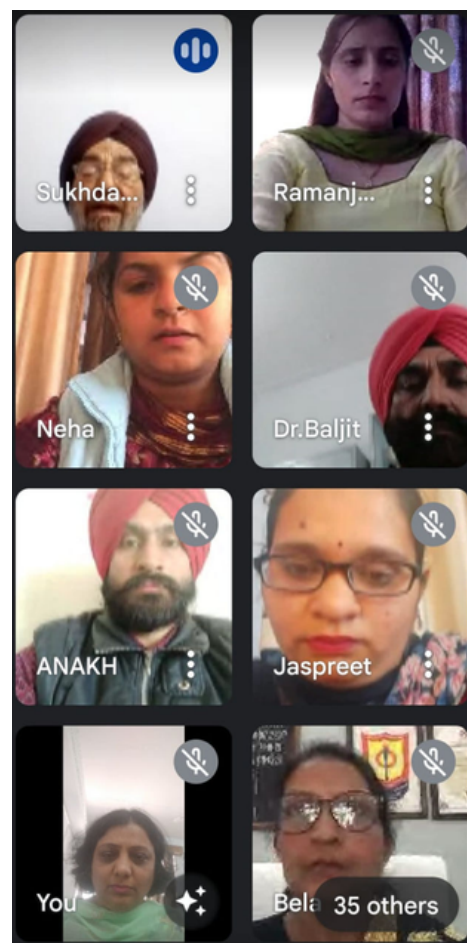

Activities: Long jump, Triple jump, Shot Put, Discus throw, Lemon Spoon race, Three leg race, Tug of War etc.



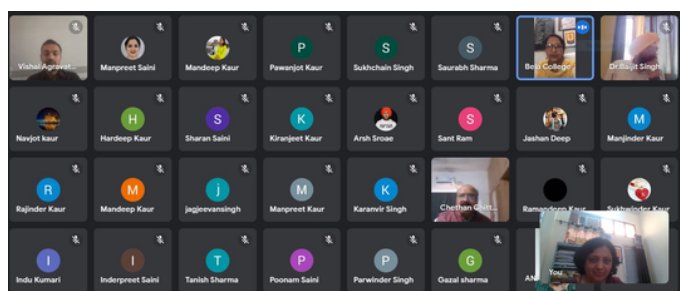

The FDP's will not only support professional practices which is important to technical education, but it will also inspire the faculty to create a competitive atmosphere for teaching and learning, directing development in both personal and academic areas.

A week-long National Faculty Development Program started at Amar Shaheed Baba Ajit Singh Jujhar Singh Memorial College, Bela by the National Institute of Technical Teachers Research Chandigarh through online mode all over India.

The theme was "Innovative Techniques for Organic Farming and Permaculture". The program ran from March 28th to April 1st, with various experts joining from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Under Unnat Bharat, about 400 teachers are involved in this program. Principal Dr. Satwant Kaur Shahi along with Management, thanked NITTER for this initiative.

On the first day, the initiatives of Organic Farming in their state by the Government of Sikkim were discussed. Prof. U.S. N. Rai, who was the program coordinator, shared ideas with various remote centers. On the second day, the experts of the Policy Commission discussed in detail sustainable agriculture. On the third day, Mr. Rajinder Bhatt from Mumbai, Mr. Joginder Singh from Himachal Pradesh and Narasena Kopula from Hyderabad touched on different dimensions of permaculture. On the fourth day, Akash Chaurasia and Mr. Vinod Yayani from Sagar described the opportunities of agritourism with examples. Prof. P. L. Saroj former director, R. Putur discussed the potential of horticulture in India.

Guru Tegh Bahdur, the ninth Sikh Guru (1664–75) and second Sikh martyr, was born in Amritsar, Punjab, India, about 1621. He passed away in Delhi on November 11, 1675. He was also Gobind Singh's father, the 10th Guru.

A commission went to the village of Bakla after the eighth Guru, Hari Krishen, the "child Guru," informed his devotees that his successor would be located there and discovered 22 claimants. A wealthy Sikh businessman named Bhai Makhan Shah went looking for Tegh Bahdur because he noticed that Tegh Bahdur didn't exhibit any of the greed or conceit that the other pretenders did.

Tegh Bahdur was then recognized as the ninth Sikh Guru by him.

A program dedicated to the 400th birth anniversary of Shri Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji was organized for the students about Guru Tegh Bahadur's Bani, related ragas. The students were conveyed the message of universalism and true humanity to the students and made them resolved to always move forward in life inspired by historical martyrs and to make their college and country famous.

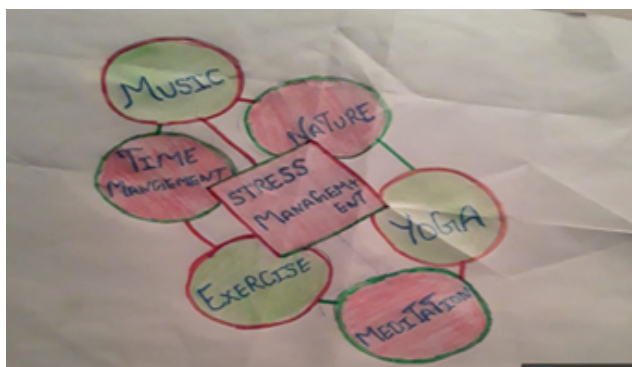
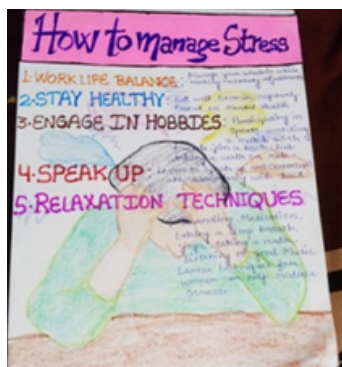
EARTH DAY

Under PMKVY 3.0, the "Skill Hubs Initiative" intends to build a shared infrastructure that is in line with the demands of the local economy and meets the vocational training needs of all target sectors. Additionally, it is anticipated that current resources in the education and skilling system can be utilized to their fullest extent by being used for skilling outside of regular working hours and on the weekends.

Ministry of Human Resource Education of the Union Government has launched Skill Hub Initiative Program in the colleges of India as a pilot project to engage the youth in employment education and our area is fortunate that Bela College has also become a part of it. Convocation was held at college which was graced with the presence of Vice Chancellor Prof. Arvind, Punjabi University Patiala as a chief guest. In his convocation speech, Prof. Arvind congratulated the students for their achievements and encouraged them to use the lessons learned in the right way. He exhorted the students to give up the tendency to go abroad and contribute to the progress of their country. He urged all to learn and speak Punjabi and said that no one should hesitate to speak their mother tongue. The first 5 Gold Medal and 1 Silver Medal winning students were awarded during the convocation. Then the students who got the merit certificate were honoured. After that, degrees were conferred on 54 students who obtained degrees with first class distinction. After these degrees were conferred on 210 students in different subjects of postgraduate and undergraduate. 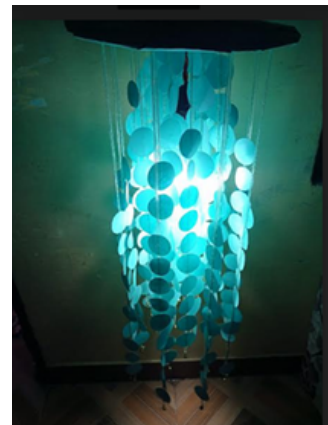

On this occasion Department of Commerce organized a seminar to give awareness to students.

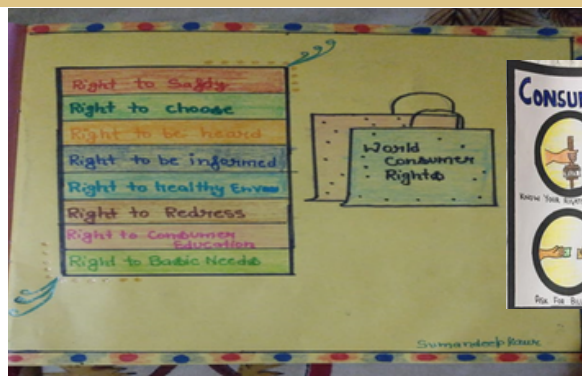
PROGRAMME ON CAREER GUIDANCE

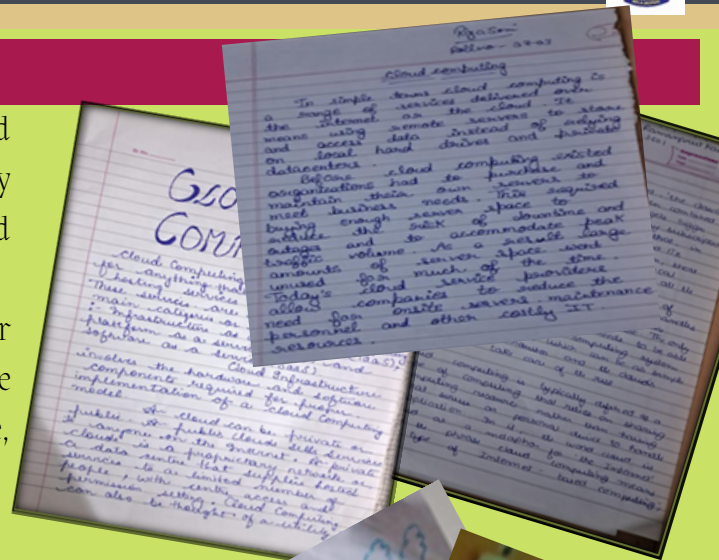

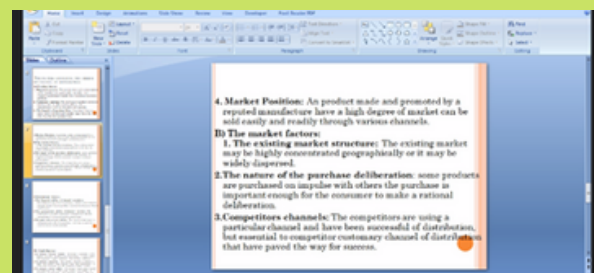

The group discussion was held on this crucial topic so that students get awareness about the Climate Change

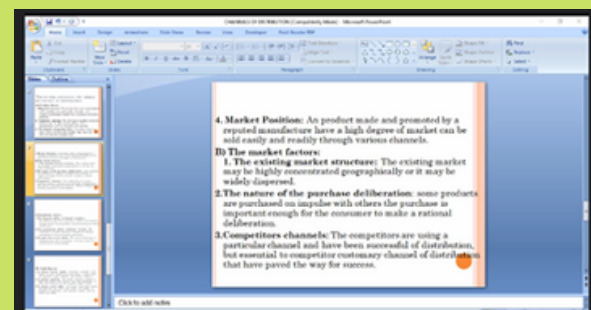

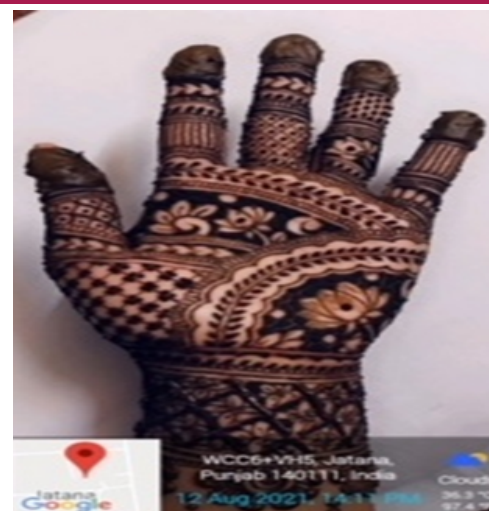
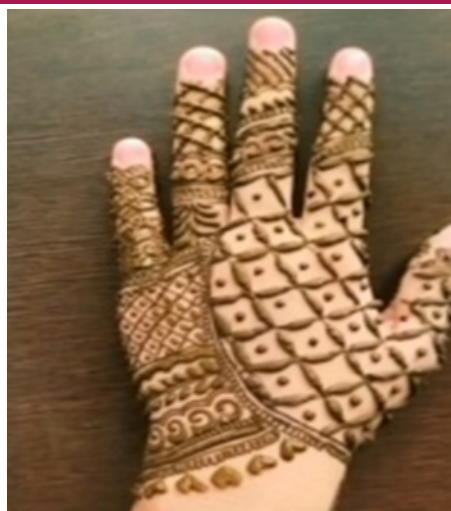
